Bank Booklet On Torrance Now Available

A booklet surveying building and real estate activity in Torrance and Southern California is currently available from Security First National Bank, according to Torrance branch manager H.P. Atherton Jr.

Total valuation of all building permits in Torrance for 1963 alone totaled \$58,721,000. During the past year, permits were issued in the city for a total of 3,581 family units.

Included in this figure are 675 single dwellings and 2,906 multiple units.

Brookside Vineyard Co. of Guasti, Calif., will open a retail cellar and tasting room in Torrance Saturday, April 4.

Shortly after the establishment of the Brookside Winery, another French winemaker, Marius Baine, came to California. He gradually became responsible for the winery's operations. Baine married Marceline Cache and the winery is still operated by the Baines.
