

Area GOP Rally Set Next Week at Torrance High

George Murphy, a candidate for the Republican nomination for the United States Senate, will address a rally Thursday, April 9, at Torrance High School auditorium. The rally is co-sponsored by the Torrance Republican Club, Inc., and the Torrance Republican Federated Women's Club. Others who will speak at the rally include Robert Munster, 17th Congressional District candidate; Chauncey Larmer, 67th Assembly District candidate, and Damon Beckette, 68th Assembly District candidate. Since April 9 is the final day for voters to register in order to vote in the June 2 primary election, 12 deputy registrars will be on hand to register persons who have not done so. The Torrance Area Youth Band will provide entertainment for the rally, and flag ceremonies will be conducted by local Boy Scouts. The rally will begin at 8 p.m.

Cranston To Launch L.A. Drive

State Controller and U.S. Senate candidate Alan Cranston will open his official Los Angeles headquarters on Saturday, April 4, at 2:30 p.m., it was announced today.

The headquarters, at 2121 Beverly Blvd., just off Alvarado, will "be the rallying point for the volunteer drive in Los Angeles County for my campaign for the United States Senate," Cranston said.

Attending the Saturday opening will be Cranston, all the members of his campaign staff, volunteers from all over Southern California, and members of the press. The public is invited to attend and meet the candidate. Cranston will address the workers and there will be food and entertainment.

"It is with great pleasure that I announce this opening," Cranston said. "I feel certain that with the help of our many friends who will be present Saturday, we will win this race."

Cranston has been Controller since 1958.

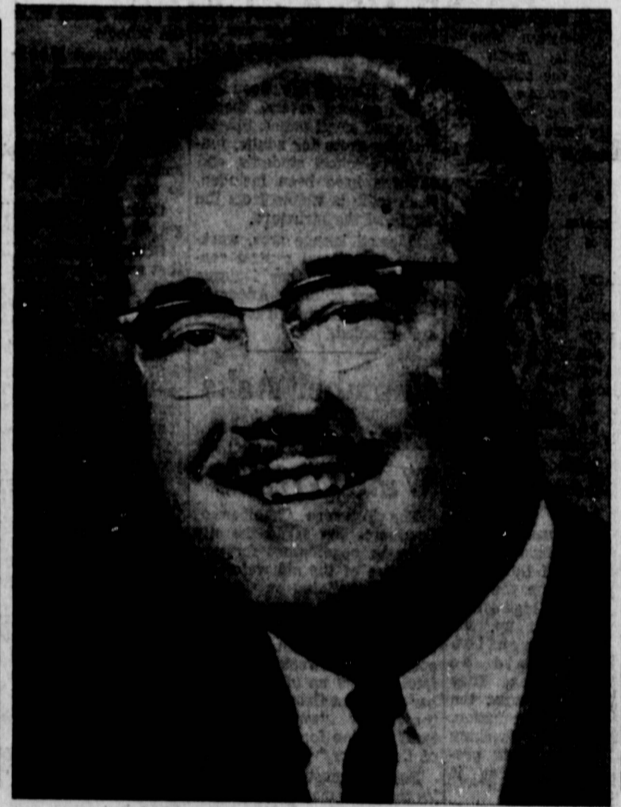
