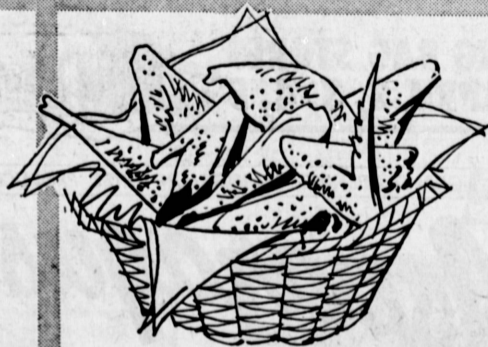

Teen Musicians Compete At Morningside Saturday

Twenty-nine Torrance teenagers will face their final test in a five-months-long quest for the Hollywood Bowl Battle of the Bands competition at Morningside High School Saturday at 8 p.m.

Featured on the program Saturday night will be two hours of jazz, musical comedy and popular arrangements.

Competing will be solo vocalist Sherrie Schneider, Paul's Esquires, the Squires and the Imperials dance bands.

Performers named to the June 26 Bowl finals will be selected by John Tynan, West Coast editor of "Downbeat" magazine; Gordon Jenkins Jr., of the Bowl, and Robert McDonald and Robert Fisher, chairmen of the Los Angeles Valley College and East Los Angeles College music departments, respectively.

FINALISTS WILL appear beside noted professionals in the Bowl production. Highlights of the finals will be televised at a later date.

Torrance, with its many teen musicians, has emerged as the best-represented city in this annual musical event.

Winners will be presented awards in five divisions, including school dance bands, dance bands, combos, vocal groups and solo vocalists. Three individual musicians will be selected for special recognition, and the best band or combo to appear in the Bowl will be named Sweepstakes winner.

THE BATTLE of the Bands is sponsored by the County of Los Angeles Department of Parks and Recreation. Admission to the Morningside preliminaries Saturday evening will be 50 cents.
