'MacBeth' Selected for Tribute to Shakespeare

"Macbeth," Shakespearean tragedy of political ambition, will be presented by El Camino College April 3, 4, 10 and 11 at 8:30 p.m. in the El Camino College Campus Theater.

A company of 33 students, directed by Dr. Howard M. Banks will act out the 358-year-old tragedy as a commemoration of the 400 birthday of William Shakespeare.

Portraying Lady MacBeth, Claudia Wilkens will co-star with Doug Phelps who plays MacBeth, Duncan, King of Scotland, will be depicted by Allen King.

SINCE ITS first performance in 1605, the play has appeared in many theaters throughout the United States. El Camino's Campus theater will feature a replica of the Globe Theater, typical of those used during

the reign of Queen Elizabeth I, for its production.

When asked why he selected "Macbeth" as best suited to celebrate the birth of Shakespeare, Dr. Banks commented, "Macbeth" is a play entertaining to both the young and old and although Shakespeare's writing reflect the beliefs and living conditions of his own time, many of his comments still fit present-day circumstances."

The three witches, who prophesied future events of Macbeth's life are portrayed by Connie Mangan, Helen Thompson and Sandra Buckels. Additional players are Michael Hicks as Ross, Timothy Brennan as Fleance, Gary Stephens as Seyton; Leon Guillotte as Gaithness; Bob Shumate as Angus and Adolph Buelno as a wounded soldier returning from battle.

RONALD BURGESS portrays the patriot, Macduff; Lady Macduff will be performed by Donna Lynn Trumpler; Malcolm will be performed by John Wilson.

Donalbain, will be acted by Mike McLean; Lennox will be portrayed by Barry Cravey; and Banquo, who's ghost appears before the conscience-stricken Macbeth is played by Terry Collier.

The three murderers who skillfully rid those in the path of Macbeth are played by Dennis Parker, Ron Lias and Gary Stephens. The apparitions are portrayed by Lauren Letteriello.

Three Area Men Help With Film

"The Starfighters," appearing at the San Pedro Drive In and fifty other theaters locally, stars Richard Jordahl and Dick Miller, both well-known to Torrance and South Bay theatergoers.

Jordahl, of 5325 Danaha St., plays a tough but understanding squadron commander in the film. He is no stranger to the USAF, having served in Korea where he flew C-119 transports. He turned to acting after his tour of duty with Uncle Sam.

Miller, going under the screen name of Richard Masters, has the vocal and physical characteristics to play the part of a stern wing commander under whose tutelage serve a number of jet pilots.

These men head a cast of other Hollywood actors and Air Force personnel in this active drama about the pilots who fly the "missile with a man in it"—the F-104 Starfighter.

PRODUCED and directed by Will Zens, a resident of Rolling Hills who also produced the well-known "Torrance, City of Industrial Opportunity" film a decade ago, "The Starfighters" is in Technicolor and contains some of the best air photography ever seen. Audiences are treated to the rides of their lives as they go along on refueling missions, napalm and bomb drops, strafing, rescues, and the like.

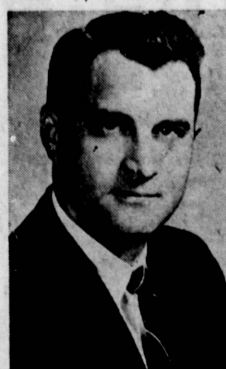
reted cities situated along a rock-ribbed coast. It is often called Europe's Miracle Province. Tuscany is the heart of Italy, literally and artistically. It cradled the mysterious Etruscan civilization.

Two Saints brought glory to the region in the Middle Ages. First, St. Catherine who was born at Siena, and St. Francis of Assisi.

In the sciences Tuscany won everlasting fame as the home of Galileo, who laid the base for modern scientific progress.

Stan Walsh lived in Europe for five years, and with his camera captured many subjects rarely seen by the casual visitor. Along with producing the first complete color film on Tuscany, he also filmed shore subjects along the Rhine, in Scotland, and in London.

Walsh's earlier film production and travel experience came by way of service with the Ninth Air Force as a navigator and mission photographer during World War II. He is a graduate of the University of Southern California.
