

Redondo Group Hopes To Open Anza Ave.

Efforts to open Anza Avenue through the cities of Redondo Beach, Hawthorne, and Torrance as a major highway will be renewed this week by representatives of the North Redondo Beach Business and Professional Men's Assn.

Dr. Roy C. Sanderson and Rodney Nielsen, president and vice president of the group, are in Sacramento now trying to secure information from the State Division of Highways on future plans for Anza Avenue.

Anza Avenue runs from Calle Mayor to 190th Street in Torrance and from Rosecrans Boulevard north. The section between 190th Street and Rosecrans Boulevard is not open, while the section between Torrance and Del Amo boulevards is a two-lane roadway.

DR. SANDERSON, who said his group would oppose the

proposed Hawthorne Freeway, will ask that Anza Avenue be opened as a four-lane major highway from Pacific Coast Highway to Rosecrans Boulevard.

Once plans for the Hawthorne, Pacific, and Artesia freeways are known, Dr. Sanderson plans to appear before the city councils in Hawthorne, Redondo Beach, and Torrance to request improvement and widening of Anza Avenue. The same request will be made of the Board of Supervisors, said Dr. Sanderson.

"Establishment of a tri-city, north-south boulevard might offset pressures to establish a Hawthorne Freeway," said Dr. Sanderson. "The freeway would cut through valuable industry, businesses, churches, and schools, and divide the Redondo residential community," he added.
