

# Becker Prayer Amendment Support Rally Scheduled

Sam A. Cavnar, executive director of the National Project Prayer, has announced nationwide rallies in support of the Becker Prayer Amendment in the House and the Simpson Amendment in the Senate will be held Saturday, April 11.

The rallies will be held in all 50 states to focus attention on the two amendments, aimed at overturning the Supreme Court decision banning non-denominational prayers and Bible readings in the public schools.

Cavnar said he hopes efforts will be concentrated on Washington to seek action before the end of the current session of Congress. To date, 151 representatives have signed the discharge petition which would bring the Becker

Amendment to a vote in the House. Only 67 more signatures are needed, said Cavnar. Congressman Frank Becker (R-New York) told The HERALD during an exclusive interview last December that his discharge petition then had 118 signatures. A total of 218, one more than half of the total members of the House, are necessary to get the amendment out of committee.

The Los Angeles area rally will be held in the Shrine Auditorium. Rhonda Fleming, national co-chairman and official hostess, will head the program. The Sheriff Peter J. Pitchess is the California chairman.

Tickets for the rally will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis. Tickets may be

obtained by calling Project Prayer, HOLLYWOOD 6-4766, or writing to 1717 N. Vine St., Hollywood 28.

Members of the Project Prayer may use the tickets issued for the February rally which was postponed. Minimum membership fees for non-members are \$3 for adults and \$1 for persons under 18. All money will be used to support Project Prayer across the nation.
