Board President Bert M. Lynn spearheaded the drive to save the money when he suggested the trustees take adventises of a free consulting

suggested the trustees take advantage of a free consulting service offered by the utilities before spending "all that money."

Lynn was immediately assured that the Southern California Edison Co, and the Pacific Telephone Co, would cooperate by representatives who attended the meeting. Lynn said he had received the same assurance from the Southern California Gas Co, by telephone.


