Schools Save

Utilities Offer Free Consultant Services

A savings of somewhere between \$500 and \$9,175 was recorded this week by the Board of Education when members refused to hire a utility consultant for an evaluation of the district utility services.

Board President Bert M. Lynn spearheaded the drive to save the money when he suggested the trustees take advantage of a free consulting service offered by the utilities before spending "all that money."

Lynn was immediately assured that the Southern California Edison Co. and the Pacific Telephone Co. would cooperate by representatives who attended the meeting. Lynn said he had received the same assurance from the Southern California Gas Co. by telephone.

"We stand capable and ready to serve you," James Leggett, a representative of Pacific Telephone Co., told the board. Edison Co. representatives offered the same assurances.

Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools, had recommended a consulting firm in Los Angeles be hired for the job. While estimates ranged from \$500 to more than \$9,000, Dr. Hull had recommended a limit of \$5,200 for the service.

Purpose of the consulting service is to find ways of improving the district's utility service and reduce costs.

Trustees voted 4-0 to accept the offers of the free consulting service and shelved the recommendation of the superintendent.
