## Summer Session Classes Begin June 17 at ECC

Summer classes at El Camino College will begin June 17 and continue through Aug. 28, offering classes in the day and evening divisions. Classes will be open to all persons over 18 years of age and to all high school graduates who meet residence requirements. The first session of six weeks will accept registration June 15 and 16.

A LIMIT of six units will be imposed during the first session. Students who complete the spring semester at El Camino will register June 15 from 1 to 3 p.m. Evening students may register between 5:30 and 7:30 p.m.

All new students may complete summer session registration June 16 from 1 to 3 p.m. and from 5:30 until 7:30 p.m.

A second session, offering classes only during morning hours, will begin Aug. 3. A four-unit limit on classes will be imposed. Registration will be held July 31. Continuing students must register between 8:30 and 9:30 a.m., while new students will be accepted from 10 to 11 a.m.

ALL STUDENTS who register for summer classes must be legal residents of the El Camino Junior College District to be accepted for the August session.

There will be no charge for registration, but students must buy their own books and comply with California law regarding polio immunization.
