NEW MEAT TWIST

Sprightly Sauce Is Top Hat for Steak

Ripe olives are mixed with dairy sour cream, mayonnaise, seasoned salt, horseradish, dry mustard and chopped parsley for a "broiled-on" sauce for Piquant Olive Steak Broil.

This sauce is spread over broiled top round steak and it is then run under the broiler just long enough to set the sauce.

Broiled round steak is a rather new twist in meat cookery. It has no bone and little

fat and its cost is often lower than the more common broiled steaks.

However, it is best suited for those who prefer their steak rare or medium-rare. If broiled well done, the meat toughens and requires a further longer period of cooking with moist heat to make it tender.

PIQUANT OLIVE STEAK BROIL

- 1 cup ripe olives
- 1 cup dairy sour cream
- 3 tbs. mayonnaise
- 1/2 tsp. seasoned salt
- 1 1/2 tbs. prepared horseradish
- 1/4 tsp. dry mustard
- 2 tbs. chopped parsley
- Top round steak (3/4 to 1-inch thick) about 2 lbs.
- Melted butter
- Salt

Cut olives into wedges. Mix together sour cream mayonnaise, seasoned salt, horseradish, mustard and parsley. Preheat broiler. Place steak on broiler rack and brush with butter; sprinkle with salt. Broil about 4 inches from

source of heat for 3 to 4 minutes. Turn and broil the opposite side 3 minutes. Remove from heat; spread sauce over meat and return to broiler for 1 minute. Serve at once.

This olive sauce as suggested here is quite versatile. It

can be served cold for a topping as well as "broiled-on."

In fact, you might broil part of it and pass the rest to be spooned on the meat cold.

Almond Logs

Leftover mashed potatoes can easily be turned into elegant Almond Logs. Simply beat in an egg, shape into logs, roll in toasted slivered almonds and cook gently in butter until golden.
