### Man's 45 Years With Steel Firm Observed

Paul M. Watson, superintendent of production planning for the Torrance Works of United States Steel Corporation who retires May 30 after 45 years with the company, will be honored by several score friends and business associates at a dinner tomorrow.

Watson's near half-century with U. S. Steel represents the longest company tenure of any active management official at the Torrance Works.  
 Born in Sharon, Pa., he began his steel career in 1919 as a hot mill turn foreman at the Mercer Works, which was later acquired by U. S. Steel. In 1927 he was named hot mill assistant superintendent.

In 1932 he was transferred to the Torrance Works as sheet mill assistant superintendent, and was appointed superintendent of sheet mill in 1943. The following year he was promoted to superintendent of production planning.  
 Residents of the Torrance area since 1932, he and his wife, Florence, have lived at 3417 La Selva, Palos Verdes Estates, since 1950. They plan

to move to Walnut Creek, where they have bought a home near their daughter, Mrs. Ana M. Norris, and their three grandchildren.  
 There, he and Mrs. Watson, an accomplished pianist and organist, intend to devote much time to music and pursuing their hobby of gardening.
