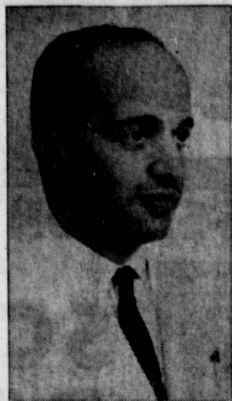


Local Doctor Elected for Markle Grant

Dr. Nicholas A. Halasz, head physician in general and thoracic surgery at Harbor General Hospital has been named a Markle Scholar in academic medicine. Dr. Halasz is one of 25 physicians throughout the nation selected for the honor.

The award, which becomes effective July 1 and carries a grant of \$6,000 a year for five years was announced by Dr. Marshall Orloff, professor in surgery, UCLA, and chief physician, Harbor General Hospital. Dr. Orloff is also a Markle Scholar and completing his fifth year.

A MARKLE Scholar is selected by a lay board of the John and Mary R. Markle Foundation of New York which was established in 1927. The award is designed to support careers

of young members of medical school facilities achieving outstanding recognition in their fields as an inducement to remain in teaching.

Dr. Halasz, 33, received recognition in surgery, and research in tissue and organ transplantation. He arrived in the United States from Hungary when 16 years old and received his BS at Trinity College N. Y., and his M. D. at Yale University School of Medicine where he was number one in his class.

Dr. Halasz, a member of Phi Beta Kappa, Alpha Omega Alpha, and Society of Sigma Xi, will continue his duties at Harbor General and UCLA while expanding his research activities under terms of the grant.

Trustees Change Policy On Teacher Retirement

Changes in the retirement policy of the Torrance Unified School District enacted last week will permit teachers reaching 65 years of age to continue work on an annual basis.

On motion of Mrs. Kenneth E. Watts, the trustees approved a change which makes it optional for the district to retain "outstanding teachers" beyond the compulsory retirement age "where needed."

The change in policy was requested by the Torrance Education Assn. Garth Belknap, president of the organization, said it was not expected that many teachers would be involved.

Teachers retained by the dis-

trict after reaching 65 would be employed on a year-to-year basis. Most of the board members said they felt such a policy would be helpful where teachers "are too valuable" to be retired. Many retired teachers do work as substitutes.

Real Estate Loans Show Big Increase

Real estate and home improvement loans valued at \$6,134,350 were approved by the Torrance office of Glendale Federal Savings and Loan Assn., during the first quarter of 1964, according to manager Charles T. Cederlof.

Cederlof said the loans during the first three months of 1964 were up 23 per cent over the same period last year. The 14 offices of Glendale Federal showed a 10 per cent increase over the first quarter of 1963.

Total assets of Glendale Federal increased to more than \$629 million, making the association the second largest federal chartered association in the nation.
