Although a newcomer to the Red Cross staff, Torrence is well acquainted with the organization and the various Red Cross service programs.

During his military career, he had an opportunity to

Serra CSF chapter. He is active on speech and debate teams and a member of Sodality, a religious organization at the school. He has been named to semi-finalist or finalist rank in several competitive scholarship programs.

The Dzida family spent two years in Bangkok, Thailand, while his father was under contract to the University of Hawaii. He also was awarded the Harvard Prize Book in 1963.

And another honor was heaped upon his shoulders recently when his senior classmates at Serra voted him "most likely to succeed!"
