She is the 1963-64 chairman of the Alumnae Coordinating Council, which coordinates all alumnae organizations operating as part of the General Alumnae Assn.; and she serves on U.S.C.'s Fraternity Policy Committee, and is vice-president for hospitality and a Board member of the Trojan League among many other activities. A donation will be given by the sorority in her name, to the Dean of Women's discretionary fund for aid to women students.

One of the charter members to be honored is Mrs. Nell Parkinson, a U.S.C. graduate, now residing in Redondo Beach.

As a national philanthropy, Alpha Gamma Delta supports the Easter Seal Campaign and the Society for Crippled Children and Adults. In the Los Angeles area, Alpha Gamma Delta assists the Crippled Children's Society and sponsored the "Art and Treasures" benefit last October. Proceeds were used to purchase a station wagon for the use of crippled children. The South Bay Alumnae Club will host the event with Mrs. Frank Ogden serving as general chairman.
