

## Science Fair Set At North

Exhibits sponsored by more than 40 Torrance industrial firms and award-winning student science projects will highlight the eighth annual Torrance Schools Science Fair, to be held at North High Friday, May 1.

In addition to the graphic displays of industrial concerns and student demonstrations, a number of, lectures and demonstrations by students and research workers have been included on the program.

The program will be open to the public from 6 to 9 p.m., according to Richard Guengerich, principal of North High. The school is located at 3629 W. 182nd St.
