### GOP Women Say Steve Was Right

Expression of support for the cause voiced by Steven Anthony in his stand against the condemnation proceedings against his home has been voiced by the executive board of the Torrance Republican Federated Women's Club.

The group's legislative chairman, Clara M. Kelly, reported yesterday that the club became the fourth Torrance area Republican club to support the principle expressed by Anthony when his home was acquired by condemnation action to make it available for the Hollywood Motion Picture and Television Museum, financed by private sources.

"A privately financed museum is not a public necessity, therefore the condemnation is unconstitutional," Anthony said. California courts upheld the condemnation.

The Torrance group also criticized the subterfuge used by officers in gaining possession of the property earlier this month.
