## ... Let's Go

In a recent column I mentioned briefly about being one of the judges for the Torrance High School Student Art Exhibit.

Much to my surprise and sincere enjoyment, I found the entire affair to be first class in every respect. The student work was of high caliber, as were the exhibiting techniques involved.

From what I gather, Mrs. Pat Jaeger, faculty director for the show and art teacher for the Art 3 and Art 4 students, deserves most of the credit for starting such a worthwhile af-

fair. Her hands seemed to appear in all phases of the planning and actual execution of the exhibition.

OIL PAINTINGS dominated the walls, which is quite unusual for high school work. In fact, judging the oils was a difficult job. There were several excellent works by Larry Parker, Fred Babb, Lana Hollis, Diane Groppi, and others.

The final judging was narrowed to a large landscape by Lana Hollis and a small landscape by Diane Groppi. The other two judges, Mrs. Ann

Adams from Chounards, Don Epperson from the Los Angeles Recreation Department and I had a path worn between the two paintings before we decided two to one on Diane's painting.

The framing on several was quite unusual. Thin slats or laths were employed as framing and didn't look bad at all.

PICKING A WINNER in the watercolor class was almost as difficult a task as the oils. It finally boiled down to two landscapes by Colin Perrault and Fred Babb, plus a large old tree by Larry Champion.

Larry's painting was the winner because of its original and direct statement. Even as a freshman when I had him in Art 1, he showed a great deal of promise.

The third area of judging involved all other media as chalk, pencil, tempera, ink, etc. Again it was a tough de-

cision because we could only select one winner. A chalk and India ink drawing of a seated figure was our choice . . . and done by another of my Art 1 students two years ago, Bobbie Myers.

THE EXHIBITION impressed me so much that I bought the winning oil painting by Diane Groppi as well as an abstract painting by Lana Hollis.

Many of the students had NFS (not for sale) signs on their paintings. After they end up with a room full or closet full of paintings . . . then they begin to start thinking how in the world to dispose of a few.

I would have bought the large landscape by Lana Hollis but it had a NFS sign . . . probably promised it to her mother for the living room or else promised to a relative.

TALKING ABOUT buying . . . reminds me that I bought a

painting from a former student this week . . . Tom Herbert. Went to see him and also to see the new work that he is doing . . . and I like it.

A large figure in oil attracted my attention . . . still wet and unsigned . . . also one of the best things that Tam has ever done. Happy that I was able to get it before anyone else.

Incidentally, Tom can only paint in his attic and there is only one spot in the attic where he can stand up, so if you know of a place he can rent cheaply so he can continue painting, please let me know.
