Four Carson High school boys were given an inside look at the function of local government Tuesday when they participated in Boys' Week activities in the Los Angeles City Schools.

The four students took the place of city officials during the day-long activities. More than 5,000 high school boys were involved in the 42nd annual observance of Boys' Week in the city schools.

Dennis Henry, 17, got a view from the bench of Municipal Court as he replaced Judge

Morio L. Clinco for the day. City Clerk Walter C. Peterson handed the seal of the city over to 17-year-old Pat Holmes.

Clifford Moore, an 18-year-old senior, took over the duties of Lt. James W. Lane, commander of the traffic services

division of the Los Angeles Police Department. Gary Roller, 17, occupied the seat of Judge Peirson M. Hall, who serves as the chief judge of the U. S. District Court. Activities will continue through tomorrow.

Garden Checklist

1. For quick color accents, now is the time to consider bedding plants; dwarf dahlias, marigolds, zinnias, asters, petunias, stocks, snapdragons and ageratum.
2. Soon on the scene, if not already, are roses in bloom in cans. Now is the time to select the varieties suited to your garden. Your local nursery has a wide selection, ready for transplanting.
3. For your camellias mulch with two or three inches of leaf mold or peat moss. This insures that the ground will remain cool and moist during warmer summer days.
4. When you decide to set out your new chrysanthemum plants, pinch them back and continue this method on the new growth until July. Pinching and proper fertilization insure sturdy, full plants.
5. You'll miss the enjoyment of fresh vegetables if you don't start tomato and pepper plants now.

"There are four places in my yard which would look just lovely with clusters of trees and flowering shrubs and now the only problem is to get them there and keep them alive. Any suggestions? Many people seem to have trouble keeping new plantings alive—the new trees do fine for a few weeks, then seem to fade away. Following these few very simple rules will bring success.

1. Dig hole a foot larger and deeper than root ball.
2. Set tree in hole with the top of ball even with the ground.
3. Fill hole with a quality plant mix.
4. WATER . . . WATER! Water roots AND leaves regularly all summer.
