

## Architect Hired to Master Plan North, South Campuses

Donley, Bundy and Associates, architectural firm of Los Angeles, was retained this week by the Board of Education to develop master plans to bring North and South high schools up to district standards.

Both schools are "under designed" according to one district official, and North High is in critical need of new classroom and physical education facilities.

Dr. J. H. Hull told the trustees both North and South high schools have similar problems and recommended the one architect for both jobs. Planning for the campus master plans may take as long as

15 months, and some construction is anticipated at both schools within 18 months.

Projections of enrollments in the four district high schools through 1972 were given to the board Monday evening. The figures predict minimum enrollments of 2,500 at North High and nearly 2,800 at South High next year. Both schools will grow to nearly 3,000 students by the end of 1972.

## Report New Post Office Plans Ready

King sent Owen a copy of a letter from Raymond R. Holmquist, regional director of the Post Office Department, in which Holmquist told the Congressman a bid package would be advertised about May 1. The letter was dated April 23. Holmquist said building plans have been completed. He added, "it would appear that in about 12 to 14 months the proposed new facility should be completed and occupied."

Site of the proposed new Post Office is the corner of Crenshaw Boulevard and Monterey Street.

## Schools Get \$211,000 for Surplus Land

Sale of 1.8-acre parcel of surplus land by the Board of Education Monday evening netted the school district \$211,000 after some spirited bidding at the board meeting.

Gulf Oil Corp. bought the land after oral bidding raised the price to the \$211,000 figure. The district had set a minimum price of \$150,000 on the parcel.

The sale netted \$750 per front foot for the parcel, which is located at the corner of Hawthorne Avenue and 186th Street, near the Columbia School.

The high written bid was submitted by Roger McGee, who stayed in the oral bidding until the price hit \$200,000. Sale of the land is contingent on a release of interest from the state. Officials said the release had been promised.

PERMITS FOR a \$35,000 addition to Torrance Memorial Hospital and \$132,690 classroom and education building for the First Lutheran Church also were included in the month-end report.

The previous high was reported in September, 1963, when the city's building department issued permits worth more than \$10.8 million.

Construction set an all-time annual record in 1963 with a total of more than \$56 million in new buildings throughout the city.
