Graduate Day Plans Complete

A staff of volunteer students, all members of the June graduating class, will assist local Department of Employment workers during the "G-Day" activities May 9 and 16.

Twenty-six students, according to Paul Schotanus, will assist members of their own classes, employers, and Employment office help in keeping the wheels turning during the interviews.

To date, 18 area employers have requested space during the two days to interview members of the June graduating classes from 13 Torrance and southwest area high schools, Schotanus said at least

30 employers are expected to participate.

"JOBS FOR Graduates" is the theme of the statewide program to help place members of the graduating classes in jobs during May, according to Murray Love, manager of the local office.

Love said, "Every resource of the office and the community will be thrown into the Graduate Day campaign."

More than 800 graduates of the expected 1,100 students who will enter the job market in June have registered with the Torrance office, said Love. All of the students who have

registered have received vocational counseling and their aptitudes determined by validated tests.

"OUR GRADUATES are anxious to make good," Love continued, "and they are ready to train the way the employer wants them trained."

Employers may still reserve space at the office for the two graduate days by calling Schotanus at FA 8-2611. Student reservations may be made through high school counselors.
