

Students Will See An Opera

Nearly 60,000 students in the Los Angeles City Schools will see a production of "The Magic Flute" at the Shrine Auditorium during May. Superintendent Jack P. Crowther has announced.

Crowther said the program of opera attendance was so well received last year that it was being repeated. Performances are being presented by the Guild Opera Company of Southern California in conjunction with the County Board of Supervisors.

Students from the Torrance area who have already seen the production include classes at Halldale Avenue, Lomita, and Normont elementary schools and Fleming Junior High School.

MORE THAN 225 students at Catskill Avenue and a group of 115 Carson, Narbonne High students will attend a performance today.

Students from 223rd Street School will attend the performance tomorrow, while 156 students at Harbor City Elementary School will see the opera May 19.

Performances will be given May 20 for 78 students from Bonita Street School and 83 Hawaiian Avenue School students. A group of 86 Caroldale Avenue students and 137 Carson Street students will attend performance May 22, and the final performance on May 27 will have 45 Del Amo students and 111 Eshelman Avenue students in the audience.

Ephebiens Named for Leadership

Economy Step Affects Local Post Office

Adjustments in window services and parcel post deliveries of the city's main post office and stations which began Monday have been announced by Clara A. Conner, postmistress.

Rescheduling includes:
• Only one consolidated window will be open at the main post office and each station on Saturday with service from 8:30 to noon. Service will be limited to stamps, parcel post, registry, general delivery and will call.

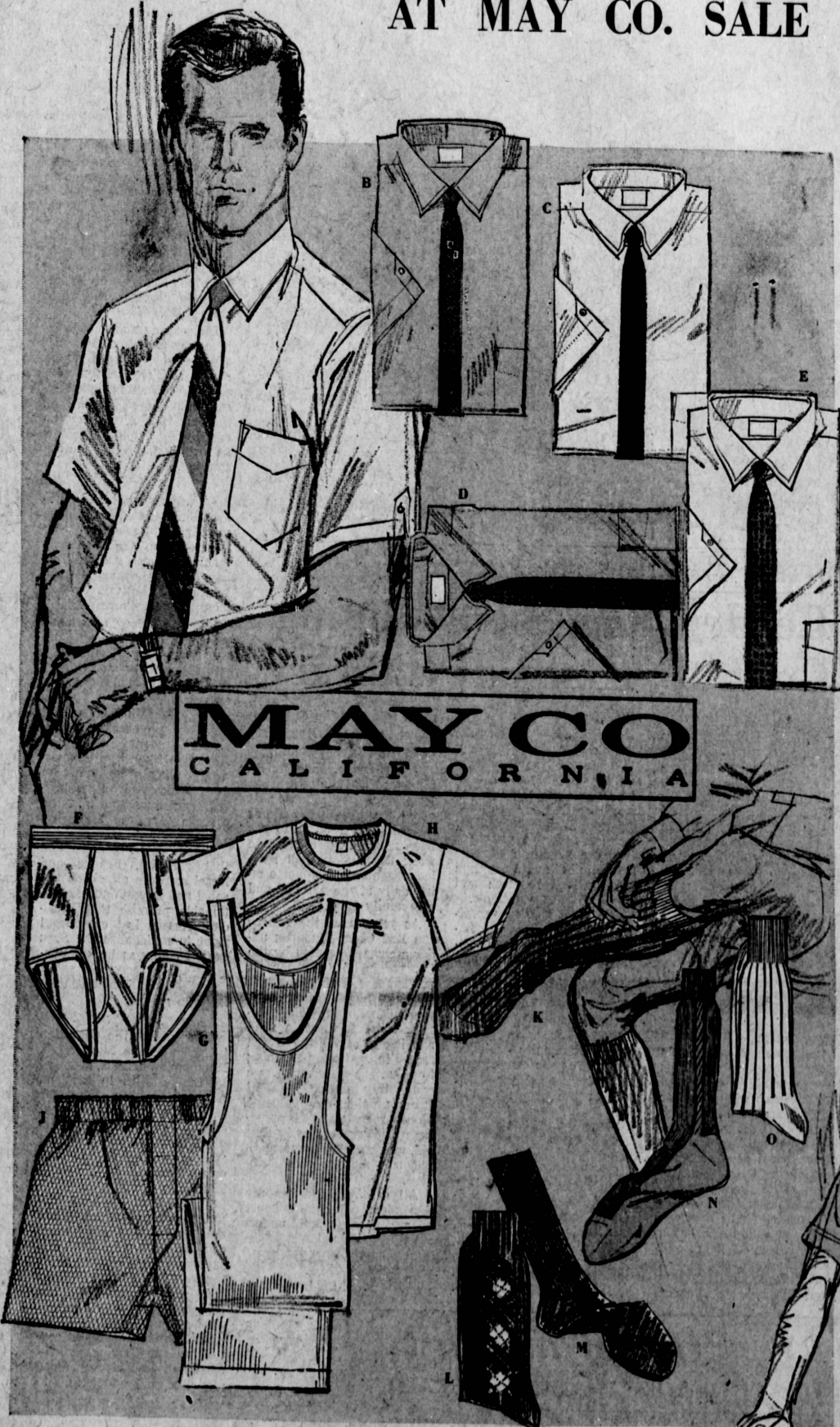
• New hours of service, Mondays through Fridays, will be from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.
• Parcel post deliveries will be scheduled on a five-day basis.

These adjustments have been ordered in Washington by Postmaster General John A. Gronouski to save \$12.7 million. The economy step is in line with President Johnson's programs under which the recent federal income tax cut was provided.

No essential major services will be affected under the orders. There will be no change in home delivery or special delivery, for example. Regular business mail deliveries will continue as usual. Letters and other first-class mail will be handled with the same priority as ever, according to Mrs. Conner.
