L.A. 'Open' School Permit Deadline Extended to May 15

Application deadline for "open" elementary schools in the Los Angeles City Schools has been extended to May 15, according to Superintendent of Schools Jack P. Crowther.

Permits to attend schools other than the "home" school will be granted provided applicants make arrangements for their own transportation. There are openings at 71 elementary schools, but only 121 requests have been made for the more than 3,400 available permits. Schools in the Torrance which are open include Del

Amo and Normont Elementary Schools. Applications must be secured from the principal of the home school and returned to the permit school. All permits will be processed on a time priority system.
