Red Cross Seeks Clues To Find Missing People

Memories will have to be long to help find Wladimir Czekan, a Pole known to have lived in San Pedro in 1939. But with only this slim clue, the Red Cross foreign location inquiry service has taken the job of finding him for relatives abroad.

This is but one of nearly 300 requests which have come to Los Angeles this year from Red Cross societies in other countries. The Los Angeles office receives about 300 such requests every year.

Miraculously, about 10 or 12 per cent of the persons actually sought are eventually located by the Red Cross. Time is a factor, and often there is very little information.

THE RED CROSS searches all available directories and membership lists, checks former addresses, and looks for possible employers. Even several clues may not help.

To protect persons who have fled iron curtain countries, the Red Cross returns no information unless the person being sought gives his permission. Many persons are elderly and could be in old age homes, nursing homes, or they may have died.

Some of the persons now being sought are Julius Magusin, formerly of Grinnell, Iowa, who resided in Hollywood in 1956, or Mollie Kastebaum, who lived at 252 W. 43rd St. in 1942, and at 1336 W. 54th St. in 1950.

THERE ALSO is the case of Mrs. Rakhil Emmanuilovna Boryarskaya, about 75, who once lived at 3914 Perry St. Another elderly man being sought is Pal (Paul) Felber, about 80, and his wife Margrit, formerly of Berne, Ind., who were known to be in Los Angeles in 1948.

Youth is not always a help. Arpad Nyitrai, about 27, hasn't been found although it is

known he once lived at 9723 Truba Ave., South Gate, and his father-in-law, Harold C. Blecker, once lived at 3311 B. Platt St., Lynwood. Gyergy Szekerez, a Hungarian, about 30, who formerly lived at 9924 Montara Ave., South Gate, hasn't been located either.

OTHER PERSONS presently sought by Red Cross are:

Joseph Campbell Baldwin, Trinidad, British West Indies, who in 1938 lived at 1334 Newton St. and was employed by a steamship Co.; Mrs. Sari Margard, who at one time lived at 851 Fedora St.;

George Rutger Morgan, about 50, formerly of Terrytown, N.Y., who served in the U.S. Army and is believed to have resided in Hollywood following his discharge;

Mile Opacic, an aged Yugoslavian, who lived in Los Angeles in 1941;

Guillermo P. Publico, born in the Philippines about 55 years ago, a veteran of World War II;

James Papadopoulos, who moved to Los Angeles from Toledo four or five years ago;

Roy Bernerth, who was born in England about 50 years ago, and who may be employed as a waiter;

Tibor Karely Petri, who early in 1963 resided at Claron Dell Apartments, 1133 North Hope St.;

Alexander A. Schwartz, about 60, a licensed pilot,

known to have resided at 1033 Valley St., Burbank, in 1942; Heinz Suesse, German tool maker, and his wife, Myrtle, known to have lived at 1015 South St. Andrews Place in the summer of 1961, and at 122 Ocean Park Blvd., Santa Monica in early 1963;

Edward Stanislaw Szbert, who lived at 2660 7th St.;

Claude A. Taliaferro and his wife Jennie J., who lived at 915 South Gratton, 514 Union Drive, and during 1959 at 1723 West 9th St.;

Izva Leibovich Gordon and his wife, Rakhil Isosifovna Gordon, who operated a sewing factory in Los Angeles in the 1900s and early 1930s moved to the middle west.

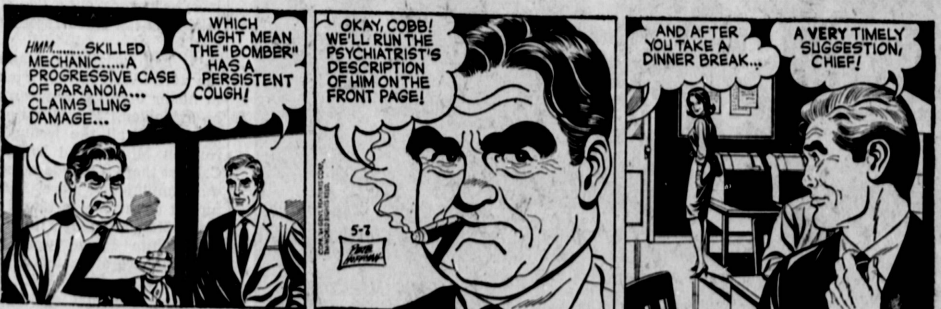
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
