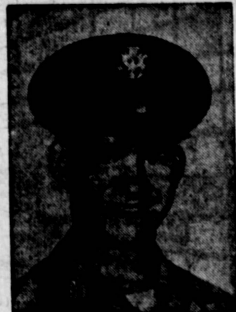


Armed Forces

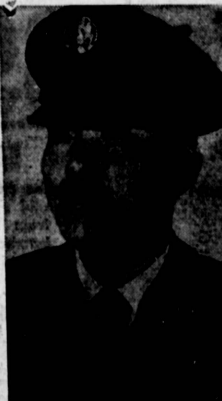
Lavoie is a 1959 graduate of North High School. His wife, Andrea, lives in Wahiawa, Hawaii.

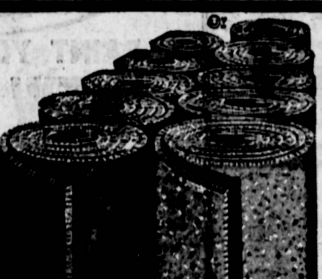
