(Continued from Page 8) that the main purpose of the 1964 session was the enactment of a budget and that allowing the introduction of bills relating to crimes would prolong the session far longer than it has lasted already. Actually, the Governor is not required by the Constitution or any law to give any reason for not issuing a "Special Call" or authorizing a "Special Session" hence it is impossible to even guess what his reason was. Finally, during the forthcoming 1965 General Session, we shall have more than six months to enact any necessary laws on any and all types of crimes.

Out-of-State Students Must Pay Tuition Fees

Out-of-state students enrolling at El Camino College will be required to pay tuition fees of \$10.20 per unit for next year, Leo M. Christian, assistant director of student personnel, said this week.

The fees are required by state law and were set by the State Board of Education, Christian said. A maximum fee of \$153 per semester has been established for students enrolled in 15 or more units of classes.

"Certain exceptions to this law are permitted by local college governing boards," explained Christian. He said the El Camino board of trustees has voted to exempt foreign students during the 1964-65 school year and military per-

sonnel and their dependents stationed in California.

Foreign students will be required to pay the fees beginning with the 1965 summer session. Both foreign students and military personnel must meet residence requirements for the El Camino College district.

\$59 Million in Taxable Sales Reported in City

Nearly \$59 million in taxable sales were recorded in Torrance during the fourth quarter of 1963, according to reports released this week by the State Franchise Tax Board. The board report said total taxable sales of \$58,909,000 were recorded in Torrance. Of the total, general merchandise stores did the greater part of the business, reporting sales of \$17,654,000, or nearly one-third of the total.

Total retail sales was reported at \$49.5 million, while business and personal services reported \$1,024,000 in taxable sales. Manufacturing and wholesale firms, and other outlets reported taxable sales of \$8,042,000.
