Marc Chagall has long been a favorite of mine. His strange dreamlike paintings always evoke a feeling of peculiar at-tachment to the charcters he

MARC CHAGALL was born in Vitebsk, Russia, in 1889, the eldest of eight children. His childhood was dominated by poverty, hunger and religious devotion. His parents belonged to a small Jewish sect known as Hasidim, who hold to a mystical belief in the omnipresence of God and believe that communion with Him is found not in abnegation — but in an ecstasy achieved through joyous dancing and singing in praise of the Lord.


