

### Board Approves Plans For School Additions

Preliminary plans for additions to both Victor and Madrona Elementary Schools were approved by the Board of Education Monday evening. The plans call for the addition of eight classrooms at Victor School and six classrooms at Madrona School.

Included in the projects are modifications to the existing multi-purpose room at Madrona School. The modifications will provide additional room for cafeteria operations at the school.

Estimated cost of the project at Victor School is \$222,366. School officials say the Madrona School additions should cost about \$224,242. The district will use funds from the sale of surplus land and bond funds to pay for the projects.

In a related matter, the board approved plans which will move

about 60 children now attending Torrance Elementary School to the Fern-Greenwood School next year. The adjustment will permit growth space at Torrance Elementary and prevent double sessions at both schools.

Special education classes now at Fern-Greenwood School will not be moved under the new boundary adjustment.

### Nazi Party Denied Use Of Schools

A request from the American Nazi Party for the use of the Torrance High School auditorium Sunday for a political rally was denied by the Board of Education Monday evening.

The board members cited their standing policy reserving the facility for activities compatible with Sunday as the reason for the denial.

The trustees also voted to inform the group it may use the facility during the week when it is not otherwise in use, provided a \$1 million bond is posted.

### Victor School Teacher Will Attend Session

James R. Rogers, teacher of Spanish at Victor School, has been selected to attend a language institute at Utah State University this summer.

National Defense Education Act funds will support the institute. Participants who teach in public schools will receive stipends for their attendance from June 17 to August 11.
