Confirmation Services Set At Covenant

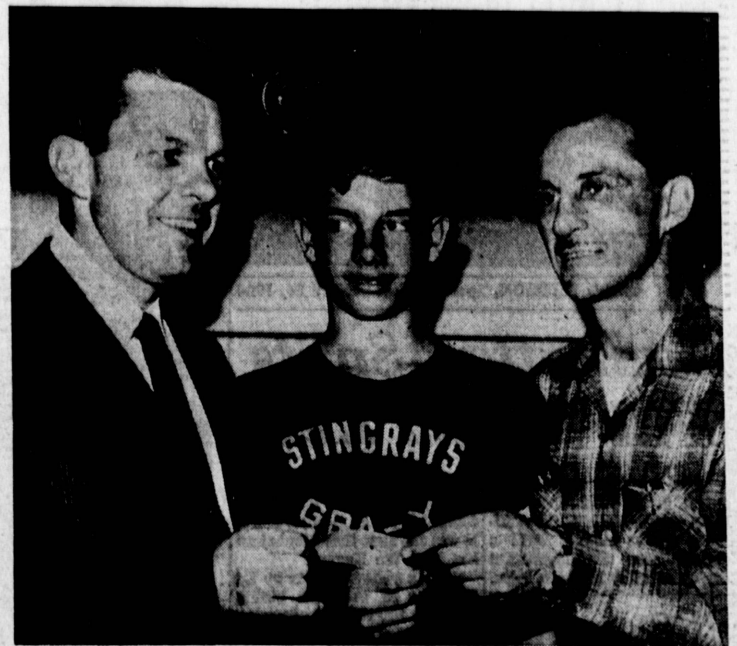
Confirmation services will be held at the Rolling Hills Covenant Church today at the 11 p.m. service.
