ORDINANCE NO. 1488 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1399 TO ADD THE POSITION OF SENIOR RECREATION SUPERVISOR WITH ITS SALARY RANGE, TO THE POSITION CLASSIFICATION PLAN.

WHEREAS, on November 13, 1963, the Civil Service Board approved the class specification for Senior Recreation Supervisor; and WHEREAS, the City Council approved this class specification on November 26, 1963; and WHEREAS, the Civil Service Commission and the City Manager recommend that the classification of Senior Recreation Supervisor with its salary range, be added to the position classification plan.

THAT THE FOLLOWING POSITION WITH SALARY THEREOF IS HEREBY ADDED TO THE POSITION CLASSIFICATION PLAN ESTABLISHED BY ORDINANCE NO. 1399:

Recreation Classes: Senior Recreation Supervisor Range No. 49 This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after the date of its adoption and prior to the expiration of fifteen days from the passage thereof shall be published at least once in the Torrance Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Torrance.
