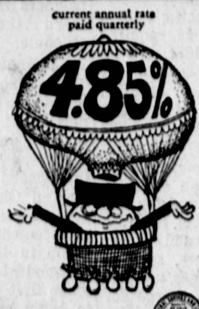

(Continued From Page 1) to cut was an administrative one. "We can't pick this thing apart item by item," Mrs. Watts said.

Dr. Hull said the staff would begin work on the cuts at once. He said the cuts would be made by the same principals and department heads who were involved in the preparation of the initial budget.

EARLY IN the meeting, Lynn suggested the district could live for the next year on the same \$2.90 tax rate which is now in effect. "I think we can give property taxpayers some relief and not raise taxes a cent—and be unique in the state."

Charles quickly came up with a tax rate of about \$3.10 per \$100 assessed valuation. "We're in the same ballpark," Charles told Lynn.

Mrs. Watts jumped quickly into the discussion, commenting, "I'll go along with taking the minimum that we can, but let's not commit ourselves to take none." She did add, "We are agreed we'll have to make some radical cuts."

The new figures will be given to the trustees Monday as the preliminary budget. It must be adopted by July 1.
