## **VA** Pension Requirements Now Revised

Widows and orphans of World Warr II and Korean Conflict veterans who pre-viously did not meet require-ments for VA pensions may now be eligible under a change in Congressional legislation af-facting death pensions in Congressional leg fecting death pension

Torrance area service officer Loren Heft said it is no longer necessary for the deceased veteran to have had a service-connected disability at the time of hig death in order for the widow and children to be en-

widow and children to be en-titled to pensions. The pensions range from \$25 to \$60 monthly for widows. For each child, \$15 a month is added. The pension for an or-phan is \$35 monthly. This ben-efit is payable to a veteran's child even though the widow is not entitled to the pension because she remarried or her income or net worth exceeds the prescribed limits.

INCOME FROM other sources must not exceed \$1,800 yearly for a widow, and \$3,000 an-nually for a widow with a child or children. The income limit for orphans is \$1,800 yearly, exclusive of earned income. The pension is paid if the deceased veteran was dis-charged under conditions other than dishonorable and had at at least 90 days of service un-less discharged sooner for a service-connected disability.
