

Many Bills Sponsored By Assemblyman Listed Again

 In response to numerous inquiries, the laws of which I was the originator and principal author during 1963, all of which are in the California Statutes, are the following:
 Assembly Bill No. 153, an act providing for the orderly and proper conduct of library boards, which was introduced by me at the special request of the Palos Verdes Peninsula League of Women Voters because the California Statutes, previous to the enactment of my bill into law, made no adequate provision for the election of library board members in several library districts throughout California, including the library district which supports the public library in Palos Verdes Estates. This became Chapter 394 of the Statutes of 1963.

ASSEMBLY BILL No. 154 was introduced by me to amend the State Vehicle Code to require privately operated automobile driving schools to hire only very competent instructors of good moral character. This became Chapter 350 of the Statutes of 1963.

Assembly Bill No. 1417 was introduced by me to raise the rank of the Adjutant General of the State of California from the rank of Major General to the rank of Lieutenant General because the Adjutant General of California commands two or more divisions of ground troops in addition to the California Air National Guard. Since an officer commanding several major generals could have the rank of lieutenant general, and also because the present Adjutant General of California, Roderic Hill was qualified for that rank, my bill became a law and is designated as Chapter 1002, Statutes of 1963.

ASSEMBLY BILL No. 1615 was introduced at the request of the City of Redondo Beach. It adds Section 33205 to the California Health and Safety Code and is known as Chapter 13, Statutes of 1963. The primary purpose of the law is to strengthen the legal authority of the City of Redondo Beach to develop its harbor.
 Assembly Bill No. 1784, later

cited as Chapter 1082, Statutes of 1963, is an act amending the Government Code to provide for orderly annexation of unincorporated territory to an incorporated city without directly or indirectly impairing the rights of owners of private property and also to decrease friction between cities and counties. This bill was intro-

duced at the request of several cities in the 46th Assembly District and also with the support of people authorized to represent the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors.

ASSEMBLY BILL No. 2002, later cited as Chapter 1975, was an act conveying in trust certain tidelands and sub-

merged lands lying adjacent to and also under the waters of the Pacific Ocean to the City of Palos Verdes Estates. This was introduced at the request of the City of Palos Verdes Estates.

Assembly Bill No. 2238, later cited as Chapter 1884, Statutes of 1963, amended the Statutes enacted in 1943, re-

lating to tidelands, submerged lands and filled tidelands of the City of Avalon, Santa Catalina Island. It was introduced at the request of the City of Avalon to give Avalon more authority over the above-mentioned waters.

Assembly Bill No. 2422, later cited as Chapter 1300, Statutes of 1963, added a section to the

Education Code to permit a school district to park or store in garages, school buses in an adjacent school district if it becomes necessary to park or store school buses outside the district which owned the buses. This was introduced at the request of the City of Rolling Hills Estates, with the concurrence of many other cities.

ASSEMBLY BILL No. 2601, later cited as Chapter 1593, Statutes of 1963, is an act which reconveyed to the City of Manhattan Beach a portion of the real property formerly granted by the City of Manhattan Beach to the State of California for National Guard Armory purposes. This bill was introduced at the request of the City of Manhattan Beach because the California National Guard did not need all the land it had and Manhattan Beach came to Sacramento and conferred with the Adjutant General of the State of

California, and with lawyers on his staff, at my request, because the reconveyance of real property from the State of California back to the City of Manhattan Beach was a complicated legal problem.
 None of the above-mentioned bills of mine which became laws cost the taxpayers of California a single cent other than the obviously necessary cast of the administrative procedure which is necessary for the enactment of any law. None of these laws of mine increased taxes or caused the levy of any new taxes.

Physicist To Assist At College

Dr. Donald H. Loughridge of Palos Verdes Estates has been named to a part-time position at the California State College at Palos Verdes to assist in the recruiting of faculty and in the planning of the curriculum and facilities in the School of Natural Sciences and Mathematics. He will join the college staff on Sept. 1, 1964.

Dr. Loughridge, who received his Ph. D. at the California Institute of Technology, is an eminent physicist. Besides having wide educational, industrial and military experience, he has published widely.

He was professor of physics at the University of Washington for 17 years, except for wartime leaves to carry on military research, and he served as dean of the Technological Institute at Northwestern University.

Following the war, Dr. Loughridge was scientific advisor to the Secretary of the Army and subsequently assistant director of the Reactor Development Division of the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission.

Recently Dr. Loughridge retired from General Motors Research Laboratories, where he has head of the Physical Research Department, and for the last two years he has been connected with the Aerospace Corp. of El Segundo as director of Applied Research Management and as assistant to the vice president of Laboratory Operations.

Dr. Loughridge is currently the regional counselor for physics for the State of California, a program sponsored by the Institute of Physics and the American Association of Physics Teachers.
