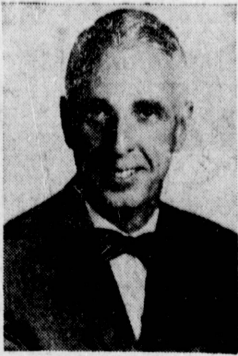
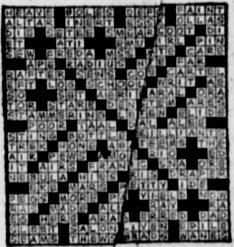
### Contract Awarded
