

Annual Chamber Banquet Scheduled for June 27th

Plans for the 1964 Annual Membership Meeting and Banquet of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce were revealed this week by Chairman Frederick (Ted) Green, following a meeting held at the Chamber offices.

The 1964 Dinner will be held on Saturday evening, June 27, at the Pen & Quill Restaurant, Sepulveda Boulevard and Rosecrans Avenue.

This year's event will feature three principal activities; the Citizen of the Year Award, the Annual Architectural Awards, and the installation of officers and directors for the year 1964-65.

THE CITIZEN of the Year award, an annual recognition by the Chamber to a person who has made outstanding contributions to the community, will highlight the Banquet this year. Each year since 1953 the Chamber has selected the citizen of the City of Torrance whose achievements and contributions have been significant to the community and to the general welfare of the peo-

ple of Torrance. The program is sponsored in memory of the two deceased civic leaders, Dr. William I. Laughlin and Grover C. Whyte.

The Architectural Merit Awards, offered for the third consecutive year, will be presented to firms and organizations in the city that have constructed outstanding buildings during the past year. Buildings must have contributed to the esthetic and architectural, as well as commercial and economic, values of the community. Contending for the awards will be architecturally promi-

nent commercial, industrial, and public structures.

NEW OFFICERS to be installed at the banquet will include; the president, first vice president, second vice president and treasurer. Six new directors, to be elected by the membership, and eight area directors will also be installed.

Serving on the Annual Banquet Committee, in addition to Chairman Green are H. P. (Buck) Atherton, John O. Schmidt, Martin M. Denn, and William Burchfield.

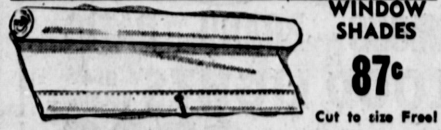

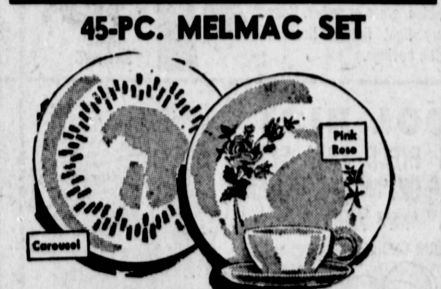

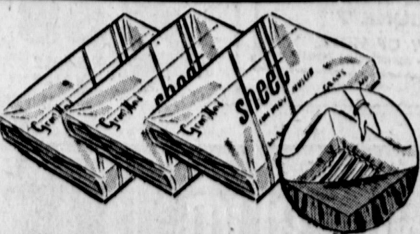
