

El Camino Wins Five Year Reaccreditation

Accreditation of El Camino College for the maximum five-year period was announced by President Stuart E. Marsee, upon receipt of the formal report from Henry T. Tyler, secretary to the Accrediting Commission for Junior Colleges. Heading the department of instruction is Dr. William H. Harless.

tional program was made in an extensive survey conducted March 10-11. Previously accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges in 1954 and 1959, the college has achieved high recognition for its program.

In his letter to Dr. Marsee, Tyler said, "I am pleased to inform you that the commission approved reaccreditation of El Camino College for a five-year period... the new period of accreditation will terminate on June 30, 1970."

IN EFFECT, the accreditation evaluation fully endorses the El Camino College program re-affirming the fact that the college fulfills the needs of the community and the requirements of the state, while following the concepts

of sound academic training. Committees have the option of recommending accreditation for periods ranging from one to five years. El Camino College has demonstrated pride in the fact that its accreditation periods have, from the earliest years of the college, been awarded on the maximum five-year basis.

Dr. Marsee reflected particular pride in the committee's reaction to the instructional staff of El Camino. "The labors of the instructional heads and of the faculty," the reports reads, "have been and are commendable. A large and varied instructional staff of well-trained and professionally-minded instructors have been intelligently recruited and intelligently oriented in the programs of their respective divisions."

"Continuing in-service programs of intellectual and other kinds of value deserve special acknowledgement; outstanding is the great number of on-campus activities for faculty enrichment and professional challenge, such as

organized seminar series each semester and lecture series done not only by authorities brought from outside, but also by achieving members of the local staff.

"Excellent facilities," the report continued, "across the campus from flagpole to gridiron — buildings with fine classrooms and relatively new equipment, services such as the library, the cafeteria, the bookstore — contribute in their important ways to the excellence of the teaching done here; but the faculty itself is the primary excellency."

The accreditation team summarized its study in stating, "It was a pleasure for us to visit El Camino College — to learn more about its programs, its people and its community. Team members felt they learned a great deal applicable to their own situations."

It is hoped that the report, the visit, and the suggestions will assist El Camino College in becoming an even more effective institution of higher education."
