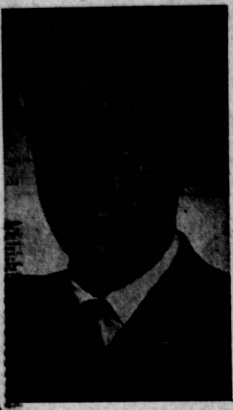


# Armed Forces

The history of the American flag will be depicted in the prescribed ritual of the order by lodge officers with the assistance of members of the Explorer Scout Troop sponsored by the lodge.

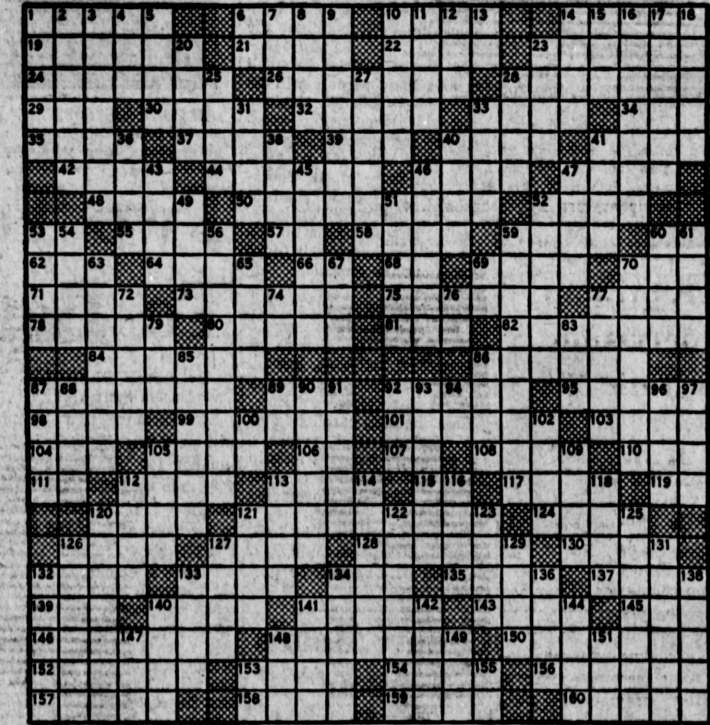
Principal speaker will be William M. Everett, past exalted ruler of Redondo Beach Lodge 1378.
