### Edison Wins Top Industry Recognition

Southern California Edison Co. has received the electric industry's highest honor, The Edison Award, for "advancement of the concept of the all-electric Gold Medallion Home." The award was presented to Harold Quinton, chairman of the board and chief executive officer of Southern California Edison Co., by Walter Bouldin, president of the Edison Electric Institute, at the close of the Institute's 32nd Annual Convention.

In accepting the award, Quinton said: "When the 9,500 Southern California Edison men and

women hear of this award, their appreciation and gratitude will be boundless. It was their imagination, initiative, and efforts in execution which have resulted in this wonderful recognition."

Southern California Edison Co. was cited by the judges "for outstanding success in the mobilization of their own organization and allied professional interests in the advancement of the concept of the all-electric Gold Medallion Home. and to that end developing improved designs for economical underground residential distribution — all culminating

in a most significant extension of the comfort and convenience of total electric living for the benefit of the public."

The Edison Award is given annually to an electric company "for distinguished contribution to the development of the electric light and power industry for the convenience of the public and the benefit of all."

Consisting of a gold medal for the winning company, and \$1,000 for the company's employees' benefit fund, the award has acquired national prominence in the public mind as well as in the electric industry for its significance in recognizing conscientious service and progressive development.

Charles Page, life science instructor at El Camino College, will attend a National Science Foundation Institute at the Philadelphia College School of Chemistry this summer.

Page is one of 28 instructors selected from a group of 300 applicants for the foundation grant. His summer study will emphasize radio chemistry, with special emphasis on radioisotopes.
