USC Poll Shows

Students Study Religion Despite Agnostic Belief

Although a fourth of them say they are atheistic or agnostic, more than 350 students are enrolled in classes offered by the Department of Religion at the University of Southern California. The enrollment figures are a matter of University and departmental record; the lack of commitment to religious belief was revealed in a poll of the students, the first inquiry of its kind in the history of the department. Why do "atheists" and "agnostics" study religion, when none of the courses is required? The poll of students indicated that (1) subject matter, (2) personal problems relating to the students' own religious beliefs, and (3) the teaching of the faculty itself were the principal reasons for taking the various courses. "We're flattered that students take our courses because they're interested in the subject matter and because they like the way it is presented," says Dr. J. Wesley Robb, professor of religion, chairman of the department and newly named associate dean of USC's College of Letters Arts and Sciences.

"But we are more impressed by the fact that many of these young people are trying to resolve for themselves the questions which have arisen about their own faith and the questions posed by an age of skepticism." All of the course offerings in the USC Department of Religion are for four units (credits) toward graduation. Any student who spends four units of time and effort on Religion knows that he must be as thorough in his work as he would be in English, Mathematics or Biology. Rated one of the West's outstanding undergraduate programs in Religion, in terms of student response, the program includes a course on "Judaism, Protestantism and Roman Catholicism." Representatives of the three major faiths share responsibilities as lecturers. Coordinator for the program is USC's chaplain, Dr. John Cantelon. Other course offerings range from the popular class in "Human Values," taught by Dr. Robb, to classes in Biblical history, literature and archeology, the last of which

is the particular premise of USC's Dr. Gerald Larue. The questioning, disbelieving attitude of many students, even those who study religion, is explained by Dr. Robb: "This is a curious and questioning time for these young people," said Dr. Robb. "Many feel that, in a sense, their families and society 'short-changed' them through the lack of reflective religious training in their earlier youth. "In college, many students come to grips intellectually with religion for the first time. And they find the study of this subject both personally rewarding and intellectually stimulating," Dr. Robb observed. "Because religion is such an integral part of the culture, students feel that this knowledge of their own and other religious traditions will enable them to be better informed persons and, eventually, more responsible parents. "Their serious concern for human values and the plight in which Modern Man finds himself in this day of the Twentieth Century is one of the most encouraging signs of our times," the USC religious educator declared.

New Parkinson Theory: Computer Is Dangerous

Professor C. Northcote Parkinson, the British economist who became famous for his discovery of various "Parkinson Laws," has some thought-provoking comments to make, in the current issue of the magazine Nation's Business, on the computer-automated industries of the near future. He is not particularly optimistic about the long-range benefits of computerization. Briefly, he feels that automated industries will run a-foul of two of his "laws": "Work expands to will the time available," and "The more complex, the sooner dead." "The computer," Parkinson claims, "encourages the growth of larger organizations, because only a large capital cost of a computer and will keep the computer sufficiently busy to justify its being there." With growth, comes centralization, because "the center of control is likely to be near the machine." And with excessive centralization, comes the danger "of too much information pouring into the head office and either an unnecessary staff to cope with the flood of information that has been exacted or else a complete failure to cope with the amount of information that can be provided."

Cohen Named As El Camino Administrator

Appointment of Wallace F. Cohen to the staff of El Camino College as assistant director of instruction and head of the division of social sciences, has been announced by Dr. Stuart E. Marsee, president. Cohen succeeds John A. de la Haye who resigned to devote full time to teaching in the social science division. An alumnus of Porterville College, Cohen completed work for his bachelor of arts degree at the University of California at Santa Barbara and his MA degree in economics at the University of Southern California. He is now working on his doctorate in the field of education at USC. The new assistant director headed the department of economics at Cerritos College and, since 1958, has taught in the fields of economics and political science. His background also includes a seven-year assignment at Whittier High School where he taught history and English.

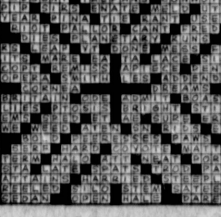
Harbor Nurses Place High in State Boards

The high average scored by Harbor College vocational nurses in recent state board examinations should place Harbor's program in the top three out of 50 state accredited vocational nursing schools, according to Robert Lindberg, chairman of the nursing division. Enrollment in the class for registered nursing or vocational nursing is opened for the fall semester, however, permits to register should be filed immediately according to Miss Lindberg. All entrants must qualify by taking the college entrance test, a physical examination, and have a personal interview with a member of the nursing faculty. In addition, registered nursing students must be residents of the Harbor College district, and have credit for one year of high school chemistry.

Sprinklers to Be Installed in RH Gardens

A contract for installation of a sprinkler system covering 30 acres of the county's South Coast Botanic Gardens in Rolling Hills Estates has been approved by the Board of Supervisors. The work will be done by D & M Sprinkler Co. on its low bid of \$38,280, according to Supervisor Burton W. Chace. Work will include installation of piping and sprinkler heads, booster pumps and electrical service.

But Parkinson foresees a more serious threat in the possibility that excessive growth contains the seed of an industry's destruction. "If business enterprises get bigger and bigger," he declares, "a time may come when they reach some sort of monopoly position within the boundaries of the country with which they are concerned."
