Ray Watt Model Features Fine Art at Home Show

A one-man show—or, more accurately, a one and a half man show—will be one of the featured attractions at "The Hillhaven," Ray Watt's 1964 Balanced Power model home on exhibit at the Los Angeles Home Show, opening today.

The one man is artist Don Kracke, while his daughter Lisa supplies the half. The father and daughter team is responsible for the 40 paintings which are displayed throughout the four-bedroom, three-bath model home.

For Watt, nationally prominent Torrance builder and developer, the model is the second project which combines the features of a fine home with fine art. The first project, Bel Air Westridge, has three models which display outstanding contemporary works from area galleries.

Several of the paintings being shown at the model home were created expressly for "The Hillhaven" by the father and daughter combo.

Kracke, the father, has won more than 25 National Advertising Art Awards since he went to work at Max Becker Advertising, where he is now a vice president. He is a member of the board of governors of the Art Directors Club of Los Angeles.

For Lisa, this marks her first professional showing.

Works in oil, casien, water-color, and mixed media are on display. Several of the paintings and drawings are from sketches made by Kracke on trips to Europe, Greenland, and India.

All of the works by the senior Kracke have been sold. Lisa, who is 5, has said she'll sell one of her paintings, and the price she has set is a pony.

"The Hillhaven" is located north of the Sports Arena and is open daily from 12:30 to 11 p.m. through June 21.
