ORDINANCE NO. 1494
AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING APPLICABILITY OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, 1954, (ADOPTED BY ORDINANCE NO. 791), RECLASSIFYING THE CODE OF BUSINESS LICENSING, TAXATION AND REGULATION OF BUSINESS AND TRADES IN THE CITY TO OBTAIN APPROVAL OF THE LICENSE REVIEW BOARD, FOR THE PURPOSE OF OBTAINING A LICENSE AND ADDING SECTION 16.18 TO ARTICLE XX OF SAID CHAPTER TO REQUIRE PHOTO OF MORAL FITNESS OF MASSAGISTS, MASSAGE PARLOR OWNERS AND TO PROHIBIT IMMORAL PRACTICES.

The City Council of the City of Torrane, after full consideration of the same, as published in the City of Torrane, California, newspaper, do hereby certify that the foregoing Ordinance was duly introduced and adopted at a regular, adjourned meeting of the City Council held on June 11, 1964, by the following roll call:

2132 AND 2138 - 234TH STREET, IN TRACT NO. 28440.

WHEREAS, on February 13, 1963, this City Council adopted emergency ordinance No. 1359 which prohibited building in the Torrance Oil Field Flood Hazard Area (Drainage District S-A; and N.W. 1/4 S-21, 2138 and 2139) in the office of the county recorder of said county.

WHEREAS, the transfer of title to Lot 4, being 2126 - 234th Street, has been prevented because of the record of said ordinance.

WHEREAS, if such occupancy permits are not granted, the owners of said property will not be able to sell or lease the said property.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Torrane, by its ordinance as follows:

SECTION 1. That the following described properties are hereby excluded from the above-mentioned restriction on Building Construction in Restricted Zones" signed by Richard H. M. President of Meins Construction Company, dated November 26, 1963; and that the City Clerk is hereby directed to record said record with the Recorder of Los Angeles County.

SECTION 2. That the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute a Release from the Obstruction of Airports and Building Construction in Restricted Zones" signed by Richard H. M. President of Meins Construction Company, dated November 26, 1963; and that the City Clerk is hereby directed to record said record with the Recorder of Los Angeles County.

SECTION 3. That the City Engineer is hereby directed to amend the map of said Hazard Area on file in his office so as to exclude from said Hazard Area the properties described in the hereinabove.

SECTION 4. Any and all ordinances of the City of Torrane in conflict herewith to the extent of any such conflict are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. The sections set forth above in this ordinance is hereby declared an urgency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Torrane and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately after the passage and adoption thereof.

The City Clerk will certify to the passage and adoption of this ordinance and cause the same to be published on the front page of the City Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper published in the City of Torrane, and said newspaper is hereby designated for that purpose.
