

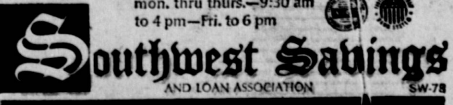

Arts, Craft Classes To Start on June 23

A double session of children's arts and crafts will be a part of the Torrance Recreation Department's summer program.

The arts and crafts activities will be held at the Joslyn Recreation Center, 3335 Torrance Blvd.

The first of two sessions will start June 23 to July 17. The planned activity hours are 9:30 to 11:30 a.m., Tuesdays and Thursdays, and 1:30 to 3:30 p.m., Wednesdays and Fridays.

THE SECOND session dates are July 21 to Aug. 14. Activity hours are Tuesdays and Thursdays 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. and Wednesdays and Fridays from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m.

The two sessions are planned around the themes—American Indians, and Animal Sculpture. The American Indian theme will feature activities of crafts, songs, and game playing. Animal sculpture activities will include animal craft work with yarn, wire, styrofoam, and rope. A pet show and song and game activities are also planned into this activity.

A SURVEY of ceramics, stitchery, and block printing will follow upon completion of work in these two themes.

Eligible age groups are 6-8 and 9-15 years. Interested youngsters may register at the beginning of the sessions. An activity fee of \$2 per session will be charged.

... New City Many June Grads Pass Army Tests

Thousands of Southern California's June high school graduates have passed their Army examinations in preparation for Regular Army enlistment following graduation.

According to an official spokesman for the U.S. Army Recruiting Service these young graduates-to-be have picked their own technical training and have received a written guarantee of choice as a condition of their enlistment contract.

SFC Frank J. Zelenak of the Army's Recruiting Station at 1319 1/2 Sartori Ave., attributes the popularity of the Army's enlistment program to the fact that under its "Choice-Not-Chance" program, qualified applicants enlisting for three years are afforded the opportunity to make their selection from a list of more than 100 Technical Schools, 33 Vocational Training Options, and several Overseas Assignments.

The schooling and vocational choices include: Electronics, Medical, Dental, Supply, Missiles, Administration, Engineer Equipment Maintenance, Military Police, Radio, Telephone, Army Security, Aircraft, Chemical, Data Processing, Automotive Maintenance, Communications, Drafting, Surveying, Food Service, Combat Engineering, and Photography. Also included are Armor, Artillery, Infantry, Airborne, and many others.
