

Teacher Training Professor Named for New State College

Dr. Leo F. Cain, president of California State College at Palos Verdes, has announced the appointment of Dr. Ruth A. Martinson to the faculty. Dr. Martinson will report to the college offices Sept. 1 to coordinate the teacher education program.

The new professor received her education at the University of California at Los Angeles and has served as a psychologist at the University Elementary School on the UCLA campus. She was a member of the Long Beach State College faculty from 1951 to 1963.

A specialist in guidance work, Dr. Martinson has authored numerous articles and several monographs and books. She also has served as

president of the Assn. for the Gifted, a division of the Council for Exceptional Children. Dr. Martinson will join the P.V. State faculty after completing her current assignment at UCLA.

Employment Office Opens Hunt For Vocation Nurse Trainees

A search for Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN) trainees has been launched by the Torrance office of the Department of Employment.

Manager Murray Love reported yesterday that his office needed to select and refer 30 persons to the one-year training course which will begin soon at Harbor College.

"This is our responsibility under the Manpower Development and Training Act under which the course is set up," he said.

All training expenses of the trainees are paid from federal funds under the Manpower Development and Training Act, he said. An unemployed person may also receive a cash allowance, currently \$43 a week, for the financial support of a family.

"We must give first priority to these persons," Love said.

"Candidates must be in good health and able to meet other standards required by the school and licensing authority. Although historically this is an occupation for women, it must be noted that men are eligible for the training and licensing," he said.

The local manager said there exists a great need for Licensed Vocational Nurses in this area.

"It can be a rewarding occupation for persons interested in helping others," he said.

New Data Manager Selected

Albert Whetstone of Plainfield, Conn., has been named manager of the newly organized data processing department of the Torrance School District.

He served as manager of the data processing department at Royalmetal Corp., at Plainfield. A native of Pawtucket, R. I., Whetstone was employed by the Gorham Corp. in Providence prior to accepting the position with Royalmetal. He set up data processing department in both plants.

It is hoped that the system will result in savings time-wise and costwise, Whetstone stated.

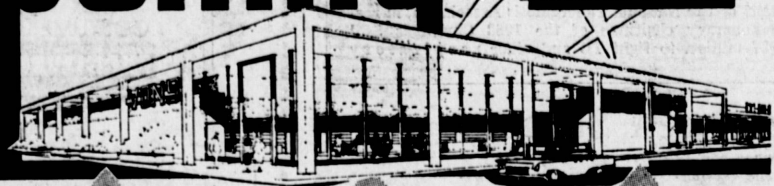
