Trip to Laguna's Art Festival Set July 12

Reservation for a bus trip to the 29th Festival of Arts in Laguna Beach are being taken by the Torrance Recreation Department.

The Festival of Arts Pageant of the Masters dates are July 11 to Aug. 16.

The planned bus trip to Laguna is set for Sunday, July 12, 6:30 p.m. The bus will leave the Torrance City Hall at that time and will return about midnight. The cost for the center section is \$5.50. Side section tickets are \$4.50. This cost includes bus transportation and insurance.

Purchase of the Festival of the Arts tickets includes admission to the Festival grounds, California art exhibition, handicrafts, ceramics, as well as artists at work.

Coast Guard Accepting Applications

Applications are now being accepted from young men who qualify to attend the Coast Guard Officer Candidate School at Yorktown, Va.

Men between the ages of 21 and 27 who hold a baccalaureate or higher degree or who expect to receive such a degree prior to September 1964 may apply.

The class, which convenes Sept. 13 continues for 17 weeks.

The greatest need in the Coast Guard is for men who hold majors in the fields of oceanography; industrial civic or electrical engineering; law; and fire protection.

Upon completion of the training, graduates will receive a commission in the Coast Guard Reserve and serve on active duty with the Coast Guard for three years.

Rabies inoculations, required by state, county, and city laws, will be given between the hours of 7 and 8:30 p.m. Cost of the injection is \$1.50 per dog.

The first area clinic will be held July 14 at the Dapplel gray School, 3011 Palos Verdes Drive North, Rolling Hills.

A second clinic will be held July 28 at the Will Rogers School, 4110 W. 154th St., Lawndale.

Two area clinics will be held July 30, one at Farmer's Outlet Market parking lot, 1820 E. Carson St., and another at Try-It Stores, 23083 S. Avalon Blvd.

County dog licenses also will be available at each of the immunization centers, Thronson said.

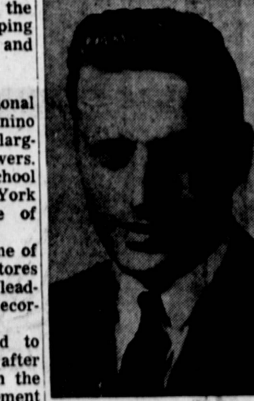
