- 1 tbs. ketchup
- 14 tsp. salt 2 tbs. finely chopped
- onion 6 hamburger buns, split and toasted

Combine ground beef, 14 teaspoons salt and the pepper. Shape into 12 thin patties by rolling between waxed paper with rolling pin.
