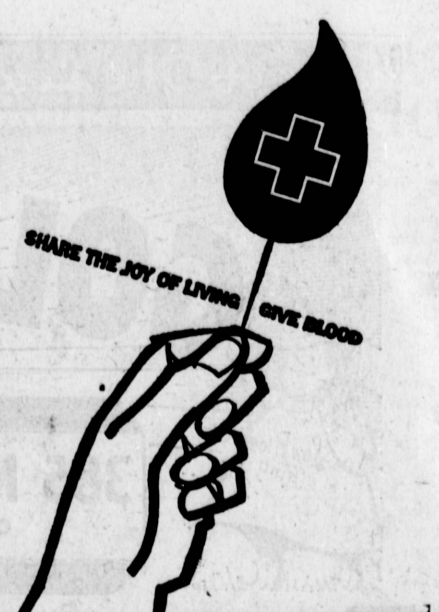
Dear Mary Elizabeth: Don't bury Elvis yet. His hair may not be as long as the Beatles'
