

New Indian Village Restaurant Completed, Opens to the Public

Completion of the Smith Bros. Indian Village Restaurant, initial part of a three-phase, \$1 million dining and commercial complex, was noted at the official opening of the new facilities to the public Monday.

Located at 4020 Pacific Coast Hwy., the \$500,000 facility was built on the site of the former Fish Shanty restaurant, razed last September to make way for the expansion and construction. Owner-operator of the 20,000 sq. ft. establishment as well as the six-acre Indian Village cen-

ter soon to embrace it, the Smith Bros. Fish Shanty, Inc. . . .

A SPECIAL invitational preview of Indian Village Restaurant was attended by South Bay public officials and members of the press prior to the official opening. Inspected and approved was a design and decor as original and unusual in concept as they are spectacular.

Mrs. Virginia Smith Haack of Torrance, a member of the Smith family and manager of the new project, pointed to the rapid development of

South Bay industry and housing as factors influencing the building of Indian Village Restaurant, which almost double the size and facilities of the former Fish Shanty.

Building materials and appointments were selected from those natural resources available to the early American Indian. According to Lyle R. Wheeler, who created the new image and designed the facility, this is the first restaurant featuring an authentically North American Indian motif. "It is typified by a tribal theme carried out

in fixtures, furnishings, food service, menus and uniforms as well as in general decor and architecture."

SECRECY surrounded exact details of interior styling and adornments until the official opening. Earthy colors of yellows, red and orange comprise the striking interior color scheme.

Among the more important features at the new Indian Village will be private and banquet facilities for social and business gatherings. Luncheon and dinner parties up to 200 guests can be comfortably accommodated in one of several dining rooms designated especially for group occasions.

In another area, Miss

Evelyn Smith, president of Indian Village and founder of the Fish Shanty restaurants, is taking steps to assure family dining will be encouraged at the new restaurant.

"We will welcome and cater to children, a policy that has always prevailed in Smith Bros. operations," Miss Smith said. "To emphasize this continued policy, our slogan at the Indian Village Restaurant will be 'an adventure in dining for the entire tribe,' she said.

The restaurant will continue its tradition of American cooking, using the Smith family's famous recipes, skipping the classic European sauces.

Mrs. Haack said the approach to food preparation will be truly American just as it has been during the past 16 years at the Fish Shanty. Mrs. Haack is a foods and nutrition graduate of Iowa State University and an active member of the Home Economics Association and Home Economics in Business.

Crash Program to Recruit Youth Advisors Launched

The manager of the Torrance office of the California State Employment Service, Murray Love, announced that application forms are available at his office for those interested in applying for jobs to staff youth-serving programs contemplated as part of a nationwide step-up in activities to help salvage the nation's disadvantaged youth.

Nationwide, Love said, Secretary of Labor W. Willard Wirtz has announced a crash program to recruit and train 2,000 Counselor Aides and Youth Advisors in the youth program phase of the anti-poverty program. Statewide, several hundred aides and advisors will be needed, to work primarily in metropolitan areas. Applicants must be unemployed at the time training begins.

AN ADDITIONAL prerequisite for selection for the specialized training will be successful completion of a qualifying to be given in public employment offices on June 27. All candidates filing applications will be given the opportunity to take this examination.

Applicants for Youth Advisor positions need not be college graduates, but must be over 21 and all applicants must possess the interest, special aptitudes, motivation, and dedication necessary for this type of work.

Love says application forms and other informational material are available at the California State Employment Service office, and urges those interested to apply immediately.

THOSE SELECTED will be given special instruction in counseling, advising, and working with disadvantaged youth.

To qualify as potential Counselor Aides, an applicant must be a college graduate preferably in counseling, psychology, social work, education sociology, or related fields. Applicants who are chosen will be given 8 to 10 weeks of concentrated instruction in one of about 20 accredited universities throughout the nation between July 15 and Sept. 15. In California, this instruction will be given through the Uni-
