## Torrance Has an Edge In Hunt for Policemen

If men interested in a job as policemen were to decide on where to apply from a list of seven advertised in a Sunday Los Angeles Newspaper they would probably decide on Torrance if their decision was based on salary.

The seven cities advertising, besides Torrance, were Anaheim, Pasadena, Fullerton, Glendale, El Monte, Palm Springs. Torrance lists a sal-

ary range of from \$621-\$652 and \$658 a month while the Anaheim salary range is from \$543 to \$660.

PASADENA LISTS a starting salary of \$534 but no maximum while Fullerton's is from \$567 to \$656. Glendale listed no salaries and El Monte's is from \$569 to \$650. Starting salary for policemen at Palm Springs is \$540 with no maximum given.

Torrance listed the lowest maximum age allowable—31—the seven advertising with

the exception of Glendale which listed no requirements of any kind except a degree in police science or police administration. Starting age for the six was 21 with the exception of Anaheim which was 22.

MAXIMUM AGE of three departments was 35 while it was 32 for one and 35 for the other.

Although Glendale listed no requirements except a degree in police science that city has the stiffest requirements of

the seven cities wanting po-licemen since the others re-quire only a high school diploma.

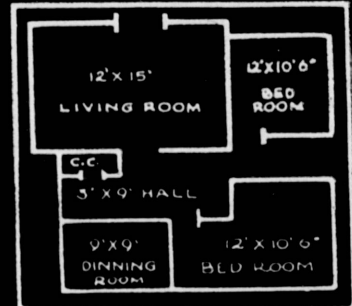
