

'Happy Wanderer' Set Summer Park Schedules

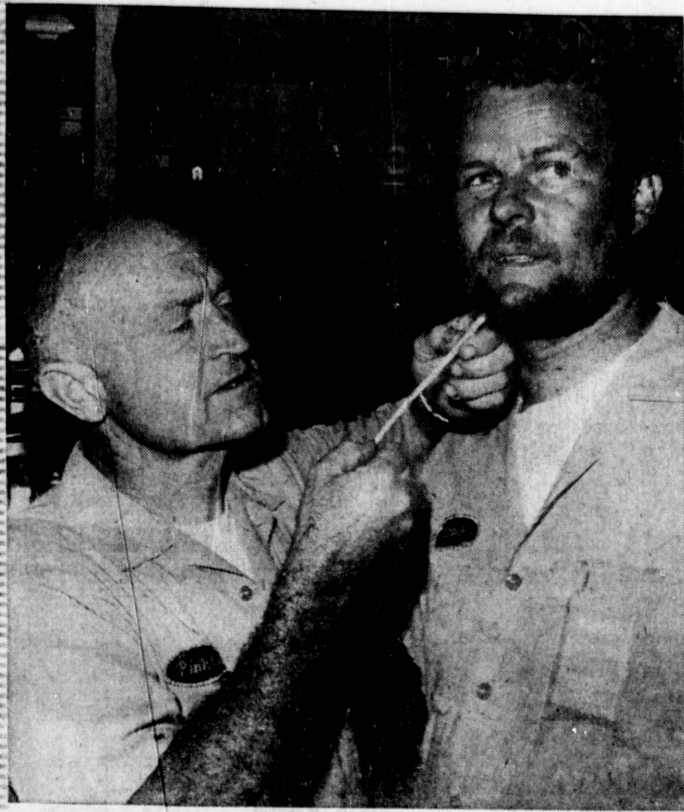

The Torrance Chamber of Commerce has announced plans to establish and operate a new "Community Calendar" service to assist organizations and groups in the scheduling of various meetings and events which are of city-wide nature and have general public interest.

The "Community Calendar" will be maintained as a free service and will be of greater value to the extent that it is completely used by the various civic, trade, social, fraternal and community organizations in scheduling meetings and events.

plan an annual dinner, sales meeting, public forum, entertainment event, dance, or other function to determine what else may be scheduled for the time under consideration. The date clearing bureau will seek the assistance of all organizations, clubs, agencies, trade groups, etc., in the city in listing meetings and functions of community-wide interest with the Chamber of Commerce, in order that an accurate and up-to-date calendar can be maintained.

"Listing of various events as to time and place will prevent conflicts for various public affairs, annual banquets and civic meetings which involve large segments of the citizenry. The problem of "double-dating" has become increasingly serious and this new service by the Chamber should prove of interest and value to the entire community," he added.

Courses in office practices, typing, and the operation of duplicating equipment are desirable. Applications, which must be submitted by July 21, may be obtained from the city's personnel department.

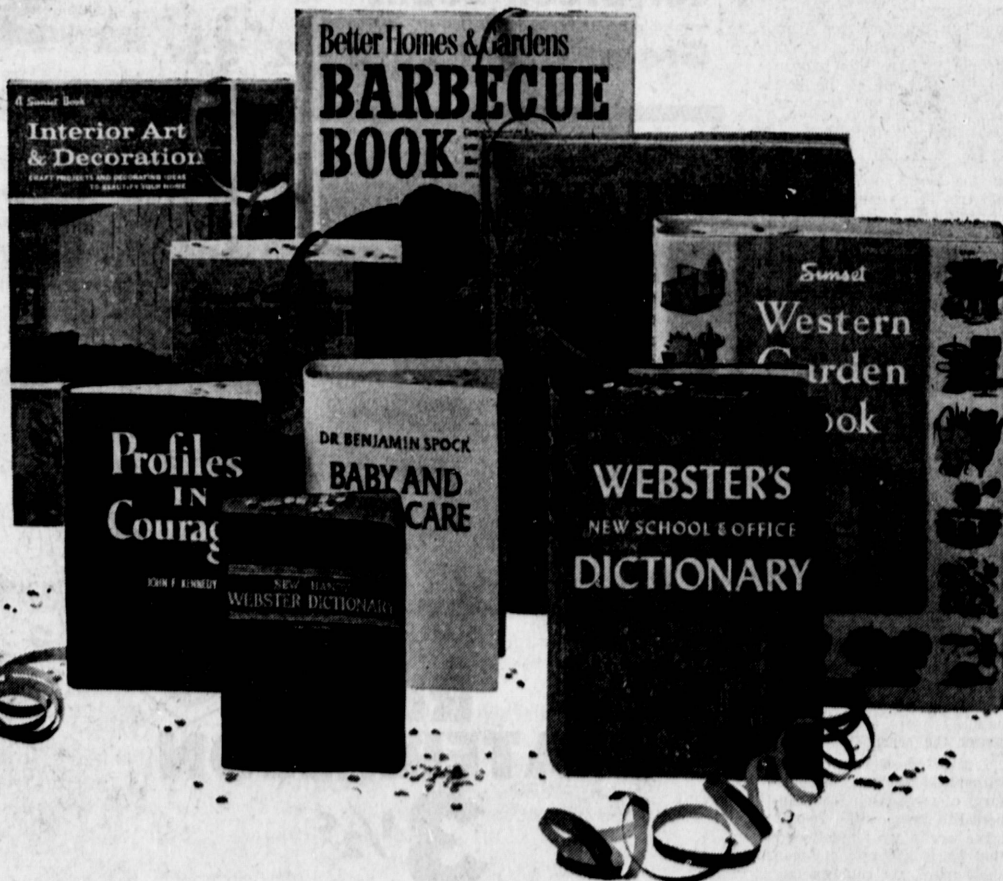
