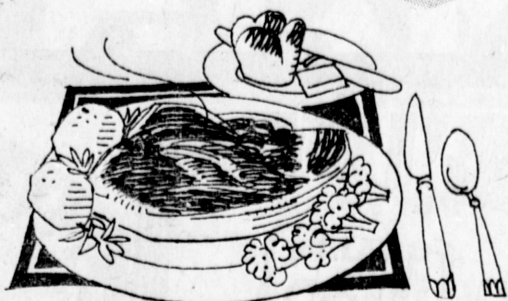

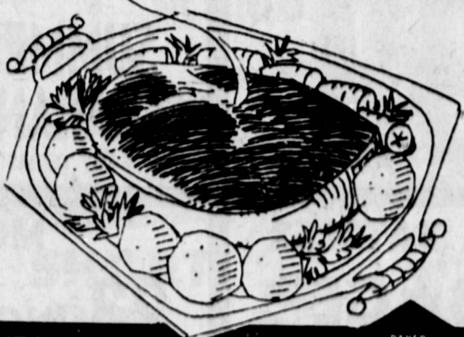

**South High Will Highlight Fine Art Series**

South High School has been accredited for a full five-year term by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. LaMont, director of the Torrance Fencing Club, will highlight a program in the Fine Arts series tonight at the Joslyn Recreation Center, 3335 Torrance Blvd. LaMont is a member of the Amateur Fencers of America and was recognized as recently as 1962 as the best amateur coach in the nation. The program is part of the "Variation" programs on Fine Arts being sponsored by the Torrance Recreation Department. Tonight's program will begin at 8 o'clock.

Dr. John A. Lucas, principal of the school, was notified of the action last week by the association's accrediting committee. The action means South High graduates will receive full credit for all work at the school from member colleges and universities.

South High is the third Torrance high school to receive the full five-year term. West High, the city's newest school, will not be eligible to apply for accreditation until next year. Notification of the approval of South High's application brought to an end more than 10 months of work by students, faculty, and administration. An extensive self-analysis report was prepared and a five-man visiting committee spent three days at the school. Dr. John C. Whinnery, superintendent of the Montebello Unified School District, was chairman of the visiting committee.
