## Boy Scouts Ready for Jamboree

Members of Boy Scout Troop 62 will leave Torrance Sunday evening to attend the annual National Scout Jamboree in Valley Forge, Pa. The troop will travel with other Scouts from throughout Los Angeles Area Council of the Boy Scouts.

The Scouts will arrive in Washington, D.C., for two days of touring national shrines and historic spots before continuing on to the Jamboree site in Valley Forge.

Following the Jamboree, the Scouts will tour the World's Fair in New York City, visit Boston, Cape Cod, and Lexington and Concord. Among the sites which the group will see are the Harvard University campus, the Old North Bridge, and the USS Constitution.

The group will return by plane from Boston Tuesday, July 28.

## Summer Camping Is Here

When school vacation begins, the Torrance Family YMCA takes to the hills, according to William Forrest, chairman of the Y's camp committee.

Already this summer, 350 dads and sons spent a weekend at Chilao with the YMCA Indian Guides; 48 teenage girls camped for eight days on the banks of Stony Creek, 30 teenage boys enjoyed an eventful week in Sequoia National Park; 18 older boys took an icy backpack hike to Emerald and Heather Lake for a week; 140 mothers and daughters attended a Y-Indian Maiden Campout at O'Neill Park last weekend.

Eighty girls, 9 to 12 years of age, are at YMCA Camp Mozumdar this week, and 50 teenage-boys have packed into the Hilton Lakes area of the High Sierra for a week of fishing, swimming, snowball fights, and hiking. Another 75 boys, 9 to 12, depart for YMCA Camp Little Green Valley next Saturday.

This is by far the largest camping season in the history of the booming Torrance YMCA, Forrest reported. Nearly 3,000 boys, girls and families will participate in one of 24 separate sessions slated for the summer holidays by the local youth agency.

FORREST credited the recent successful "Y" Building Drive for many additional youngsters. Many people learned for the first time of the vast program being offered by the record-breaking Torrance YMCA.

Coming next on the schedule is the Yosemite Valley Family Camp, open to any family to enjoy from July 11 to 18. The "Y" provides a full program of activities to entertain all members of family groups. Each family brings their own food and equipment, and camps at a special location selected by the YMCA in lovely Yosemite National Park. Soon after, groups of teenage boys and girls depart for caravan trips to Alpine Lake, Calaveras, Murphys Ghost Town, and the coast redwoods.

## Gardena Minister In South

A former Gardena minister with Jehovah's Witnesses has been called to Texarkana, Tex., to help in the organization of the "Fruitage of the Spirit" district assembly of Jehovah's Witnesses in Texarkana.

Willard C. Anderson is now in Texarkana for the assembly. He and his wife, Elaine, were named to the post by the Watchtower Bible and Tract Society of Brooklyn, New York. More than 4,000 delegates, representing 19 states, attended the assembly July 2-5.

Anderson took up the ministry in Los Angeles in 1954. He was associated with the Woodcrest Congregation in Gardena. The couple was assigned to the missionary position by the Watchtower Society in 1961, and served in Fordyce, Ark.

The convention was one of 37 such meetings held in the United States. Other assemblies are slated for other parts of the world. The featured speaker in Texarkana was Angelo C. Manera Jr., district supervisor for Jehovah's Witnesses in the mid-south.

A graduate of Biola University, the Rev. Mr. Kenney has served churches in North Dakota, Washington, and California. He also spent three years in Sierra Leone, Africa. Until assignment in Torrance, the new pastor served in the Sacramento Hope Church.

Mrs. Kenney is the California branch secretary for the Women's Society of World Service of the church. She also serves as the audio-visual librarian for the California branch.
